The pickup of solid waste / recycling will be one date late after holidays observed by Waste Management, as shown above. There will be no delay for the week of New Years Day (January 1, 2012).

2011 Fall Leaf Collection

There will be NO Saturday leaf collection for Fall 2011. Moon Township Road Department will collect leaves at curbside in the Fall of 2011. Days will be Monday through Friday, October 24 through December 2, on same day as curbside garbage pick up. Leaves are to be placed in biodegradable brown paper bags by 8:00 a.m. on day of pickup. Loose leaves and leaves in plastic bags will not be picked up. The Downs Station brush & leaf drop off site will be open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday from October 22 through December 4, 2011. Collection for 2012 will be announced by Moon Township.

Yard Waste

Curbside Collection - Moon Township Road Department will collect trees and shrub waste from residents during Spring and Fall on the days coinciding with the regular garbage pick-up for that area. Fall 2011 dates are October 3rd through October 28th.

Trees & brush: Should be no longer than 6 feet and no thicker than 4 inches, not to be bundled, tied or in boxes.

Should be placed at curb line in one direction, by 8 AM on the normal refuse pick up day.

No leaves or grass clippings are to be placed with brush. The Public Works Department will not pick up grass clippings or leaves at curb. Collection for 2012 will be announced by Moon Township.

Recycling Guidelines

Curbside recycling collection will occur every week on the same day as your regular curbside refuse pickup. Please refer to the list on the reverse side.

Nearly all clean paper and plastic materials can be recycled. The list of recyclable materials is as follows.

- (1) Aluminum beverage containers.
- (2) Steel and bi-metal food and beverage containers consisting of steel, aluminum, and/or tin.
- (3) Plastics – Plastic materials (All clean plastic, even plastic bags)
 - #1 (PETE) – Polyethylene Terephthalate: Clear containers typically used for soft drinks and bottled water, oven ready meal trays
 - #2 (HDPE) – High Density Polyethylene: Colored or Translucent plastic. Typically used for milk or juice containers and common household chemicals, grocery and retail bags.
 - #3 (V) – Polyvinyl Chlorite: PVC/Vinyl commonly used for medical tubing, construction products such as pipes, siding and insulation.
 - #4 (LDPE) – Low Density Polyethylene: Used predominately for film applications, dry cleaning bags, bread and produce bags and squeezable bottles.
 - #5 (PP) – Polypropylene: Commonly used for catsup bottles, yogurt containers, margarine tubs and medicine bottles.
 - #6 – Polystyrene: Compact disc jackets, packaging Styrofoam, (put Styrofoam peanuts in clear plastic bags) and plastic tableware.
 - #7 – All other clean plastic.
- (4) Glass – Clear and colored glass bottles and jars.
- (5) Paper Products – Any clean paper that can be torn or ripped, copier paper, soft back books, colored paper, file folders, insides of hardback books, bar line paper, magazines, mail inserts, business cards, shredded paper, paper trimmings, catalogues, newspaper, telephone books, poster board, envelopes, greeting cards, chip board (cereal and other similar boxes, must be flattened to reduce volume) and coated paper.
- (6) Corrugated Cardboard must be flattened to reduce volume with large items to be placed beside or below the recycling bin. Flattened boxes larger than 30" x 42" must be cut into smaller pieces to allow loading. Do not put solid waste in cardboard boxes. Cardboard is to be recycled.

Materials Requiring Special Handling

Material	Disposal Method
Latex Paint	Dry up with kitty litter and dispose of with solid waste
Carpet	Secure in bundles less than 4 ft in length. Bundles Must weigh less than 40 lbs.
Refrigerators	Door must be removed prior to pick-up
Refrigerators & air conditioners	Freon must be removed by a licensed technical and a required sticker placed on unit.
Construction debris, logs and large branches	Call Waste Management at 1-800-866-4460 to arrange for a pick-up extra charge will apply.

Materials Not Collected by Waste Hauler

Used motor oil, antifreeze, auto batteries	Contact local auto service center and parts store
Auto Parts	Contact auto salvage yard or scrap metal dealer
Tires	Contact tire dealer for disposal
